Mayo Clinic Health System Report to the New Prague Community



Mayo Clinic Health System serves communities by providing routine, preventive and specialized services close to home. We support local nonprofit organizations and collaborate with partners to regularly assess and address the health care needs of our community. Mayo Clinic Health System is proud to be part of the community and is fully committed to New Prague and the surrounding communities we serve.

## HIGHLIGHTS

- Implemented telemedicine for transitional care and emergency medicine in addition to existing stroke and mental health telemedicine, resulting in 24/7 access to specialists to assist local providers
- Received the Minnesota Department of Health Acute Stroke Ready Designation, which engages Mayo Clinic Health System in New Prague in a collaboration of hospitals and Emergency Medical Services agencies working to improve care and build capacity in addition to providing access to technical assistance, resources and tools
- Completed 292 baseline concussion tests at New Prague Area Schools and 112 at Tri-City United; also administered 72 post-concussion follow-up ImPACT tests at New Prague Area Schools and 10 at Tri-City United
- Grew the pediatric practice with a full-time pediatrician who, in addition to clinic practice, joined the hospitalist program, which provides rounding on our patients in the OB department
- Continued to offer joint class, which serviced over 70 patients in 2017; it is part of a collaborative approach, geared to hip and knee patients
- Achieved three year accreditation by the Joint Commission
- Nic Moga, M.D., delivered his 1,000th baby — the baby was the New Year's baby in 2017
- Welcomed new provider David Dare, M.D., Sleep Medicine and Internal Medicine
- Added a pediatric speech therapist and a certified lactation consultant

### Modernizing facilities

- Completed state-of-the-art renovations and added medication dispensing units to both operating rooms for improved access to medications needed during an operation
- Remodeled the exterior and interior of the Belle Plaine clinic
- Standardized ultrasound equipment with the region for improved efficiencies
- Added new medical/surgical beds within safe alert monitoring for increased safety and comfort
- Installed ceiling lifts in medical/surgical and physical therapy rooms on second floor and in radiology and emergency departments for safer and easier patient transfers and mobility

### Transitioning to new electronic health record

- Integrated health records with Mayo Clinic enterprise
- Increased efficiency, continuity of care and greater patient experience



## COMMUNITY CONNECTION

- Raised over \$150,000 through the Wonderland in the Park Gala and Auction to improve access and care delivery in our Emergency Department
- Partnered with New Prague High School for the fifth year of our Health Care Career Exploration Class, which offers hands-on experience in over 26 clinical and non-clinical departments
- Invested resources in community-based health and wellness programs, including Relay for Life events, Hope House, Peace Center, BackPack Food Program, Community Wellness Challenge, Yoga in the Park, school mentoring and career days, bike helmet giveaways, stroke awareness and many others
- Partnered with area community organizations and events such as Tri-City United 4 Healthy Youth, Aging Services of Montgomery, New Prague Early Childhood Family Education, KCHK Aging Well Senior Fair and others to provide health and wellness education
- Active with community groups such as Community Education Advisory Council, Area Chambers of Commerce including Belle Plaine, Elko/New Market, Lonsdale and New Prague, New Prague Rotary Club and City of New Prague Charter Commission
- Academic partnerships with area colleges for students completing clinical hours in anesthesiology, laboratory, nursing, physical/occupational/speech therapies and radiology
- Presenting sponsor for Run New Prague, the New Prague Chamber half marathon, 10K, 5K and Kids Fun Run
